Veer Bal Diwas is observed in India every year on **December 26th** to commemorate the unparalleled sacrifice of the two younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh Ji, the tenth Sikh Guru. This day serves as a tribute to their bravery, resilience, and commitment to their faith in the face of adversity.

Historical Background:

- Guru Gobind Singh Ji's younger sons, Sahibzada Zorawar Singh (aged 9) and Sahibzada Fateh Singh (aged 6), were martyred in 1705.
- After being captured by the Mughal forces, they were given an ultimatum to convert to Islam or face death. They stood firm in their faith and refused to convert.
- As a result, they were bricked alive and later executed in Sirhind, Punjab.

Significance of the Day:

- Veer Bal Diwas honors their bravery, faith, and unwavering commitment to Sikh values, inspiring future generations to stand for righteousness and justice.
- It also serves as a reminder of the sacrifices made by children in shaping history.

Government Recognition:

- The day was formally announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2022 during the Prakash Parv celebrations of Guru Gobind Singh Ji.
